Open Forum

Cllr Burgess welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Mrs. Susan Jones, from Knapp Lane chose to attend the meeting due to the ongoing saga with BT over the broadband. There is good speed at the moment, but the residents were promised an upgrade to cabinet 5 in the 1st phase of improvements, the development is now it's in the 2nd phase and the upgrade may be dropped off from this phase too. The numbers affected are the 860 numbers, the 890 has already been done.

Cllr Cook reported that the Uley exchange has been upgraded to fibre and the 890 end of the village is on the upgraded exchange but unfortunately the cabinet at Far Green has not been upgraded. So the position at the moment is no one knows what is happening. Cllr Cook has emailed but there has not been any response. Openreach do not deal directly with the public all communication must go through faster shire.

Neil Carmichael has been contacted regarding the issue and Cllr Dewey will speak to Steve Lydon.

Mr Jonathan Leigh reported he was not sure when Cllr Cook was last in touch with fastershire, Mr Leigh has contacted them via the website and filled in the relevant section about due an upgrade. The response Mr Leigh received back is that particular box is not due an upgrade but may be entitled to other funding.

Serge - nothing to report.

Cllr Dewey reported further to the the last full council meeting the budget and council tax were put forward and all passed. There is £8 million allocated to the new council homes being built in the district. SDC is one of the few councils still building new council homes. Also £3 million has been allocated to regenerate the canals.

There is a cycling and walking plan for the district 300k and some will go to funding a new walking/cycling officer.

Money has been allocated to the lido in Stroud, to provide heat and power.

The new development proposed for Betworthy Farm is before the planning committee on the 21st March. Cllr Dewey spoke to John Longmuir about the increase of affordable houses to 14 from 12 this is aimed at trying to provide houses for the next 30 years.
